Music

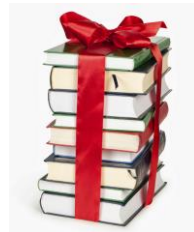
Dragon Choir starts up on Monday, January 22nd after school. New members may join at this time as long as they are in 4th, 5th or 6th grade.

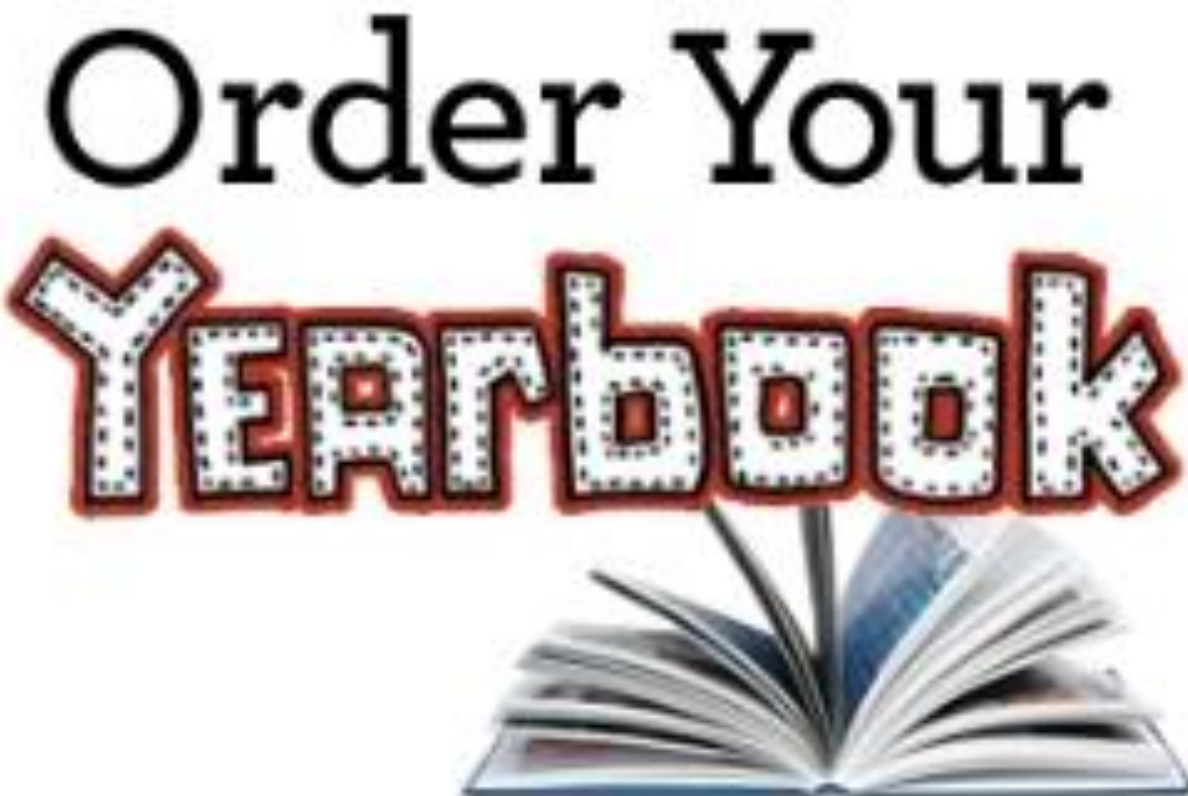

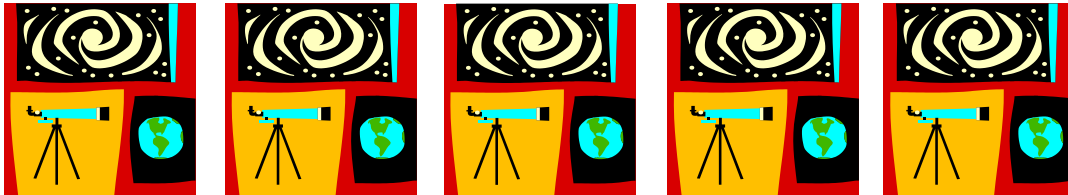

HOMER DAVIS SCIENCE FAIR JANUARY 31ST!

If your child is in the 4th, 5th or 6th grade, he or she has been working on a science fair project over the past couple of months. **Please see your student's teacher for deadline dates.** Set up for fair begins in our MPR on Monday, January 30th. Judging will take place Tuesday, January 31st during school hours. **Open house for parents and the community will take place Tuesday evening from 5:00 to 6:00 P.M.** Hope to see you there!

Students have begun the scientific inquiry process by questioning and creating a hypothesis to answer their question. They have researched their topics and run experiments to test their hypothesis. Now the students will begin to analyze their results and begin to draw conclusions. During the last few weeks, each child will begin to document their science fair project on a display board provided by the school. A science fair guide booklet and/or folder has been provided to each student to help them complete their project. All students will need to return this booklet to their classroom teacher this month.

Please assist your children as they complete the steps in the scientific inquiry process, but remember this project is to be completed by the student. Since the majority of this work is to be **completed at home (5th and 6th graders)**, they may need help organizing their projects and meeting deadlines created by their teachers. If you have any questions, we will be happy to answer them for you.
