Dear Parents and Families,

We are off to a very smooth start to the 2017-18 school year at Homer Davis. Whether you are a returning Dragon family or new to our school, I can assure you that our team works very hard each day to create a personalized learning experience for every child. Each grade level's curriculum is being driven by the Arizona College & Career Readiness Standards. Daily lessons are created and delivered following district provided curriculum maps. As we begin the new school year, please help your child be the best they are capable of becoming by:

- Reading 20 minutes each night
- Volunteering in your child's classroom
- Practicing and mastering grade level math facts
- Completing homework assigned Monday through Thursday
- Being on time to school and preventing absences (School begins- 7:55 & Ends- 2:10)
- Following the PeaceBuilder Rules
- Taking pride in our school and respecting others
- Utilizing Power School Parental Portal to monitor student grades (3rd-6th)

As you may be aware, the federal government has reauthorized the Elementary and Secondary School Act (ESEA). The reauthorization has mandated several changes in Title 1 schools with an increased effort to inform parents. I am writing to let you know of some of your rights under ESEA. Under ESEA, you can request information concerning the professional qualifications of your child's teacher(s). To be more specific, you may request any of the following information, at a minimum:

- * Whether your child's teacher meets Arizona teacher qualifying and licensing criteria for the grade level or subject area which the teacher teaches;
- * Whether your child's teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status from the State Dept. of Education;
- * The baccalaureate degree major of the teacher and any other graduate certification or degree held by the teacher;
- * Whether paraprofessionals (teacher aides) provide any services to your student and, if so, you may request information on the qualifications of those individuals.


Second Grade

We are all excited to have our wonderful Homer Davis Dragons back after a restful summer. All of our third graders have come ready to learn! To learn, we must practice, so third graders can expect homework every night, Monday through Thursday. It is very important that homework be turned in on time! Homework is due the day after it is assigned. Third grade students should be responsible for their own homework, and should complete the homework as independently as possible. Reading every night is part of the homework—third graders should be reading 20 minutes every day and parents can be asking questions about what they read. We have a new math curriculum and the students will be working through math investigations to learn the standards. Please encourage your children to be practicing addition, subtraction, and multiplication math facts as much as possible and explaining their work for math. This will greatly help their math skills! Ask your children what they are learning each day after school! We are investigating Earth Materials and they should have many new vocabulary words to share with you!


