DISTRICT-WIDE ELEMENTARY LOCKDOWN DRILL ON WEDNESDAY, APRIL 10TH

HOMER DAVIS ELEMENTARY PARENTS AND FAMILIES:

On Wednesday, April 10th during an unannounced time, we will be conducting a lockdown drill. During this drill, we will have a teacher standing and waving a red flag, representing the presence of a dangerous person on campus. When students hear the lockdown notification, they will stop to assess whether they can see or hear the teacher with the red flag. Then they will practice how they would respond if they heard an unexpected lockdown notification

Before the drill, teachers will review the specific procedures your child should follow in this situation. Your child will also learn the name of the teacher who will be waving the flag, and where that teacher will be located. The only detail that your child will not learn ahead of the drill is the exact time that day when the drill will occur.

Durante un tiempo no anunciado, a un maestro de pie con una bandera roja, representando la presencia de una persona peligrosa en el campus. 
